

Almoner's Report

The Following is my report on the following persons:

Wor Bro David Avery is still has some muscle spasms other than that David is well.

Wor Bro Jeff Brown has a Doctors appointment on Friday 21st March 2014 and his health at present has stabilised. Jeff sends his best wishes to the Brethren of the Lodge and his apologies for the March meeting.

Bro Les Fossey is maintaining his health. Les sends his regards to all the Brethren.

Wor Bro Peter Hassall is going for a pre operation check up on Friday 21st March 2014, for an exploratory operation on the 1st April 2014 at Ipswich Hospital for day surgery. Peter wishes to be remembered to all the Brethren of the Lodge.

Wor Bro Ron Walker was diagnosed on the 5th March 2014 with multiple new pulmonary metastases identified in both Lungs the largest of which lies in the left lobe measuring 3.7 CM X 3.1 CM. as well as large Lymph nodes measuring 2.9 CM.

Wor Bro Walker commenced Chemo Therapy on Wednesday 12th March 2014 and will be receiving Chemo every two weeks till 30th July 2014. I was able to receive the first dose of Chemo fairly well with a severe headache on Friday Morning but was discharged on Friday Afternoon.

Therefore I apologise for the March, April and May meetings as I will be entering Hospital on the Wednesday before the Thursday meeting nights and I am always in Hospital from the Wednesday till the Friday each week.

I am maintaining a positive attitude at this point in time and I have been able to arrange Ambulance Transport to and from the Hospital. Any moral support I can receive from the Brethren of the Lodge in the next few months would be greatly appreciated.

I have not heard from any of the other Brethren or widows of the Lodge as to their current health.
